- 1. Walking with our Saviour in the Light, 1 John 1:7
 - Other passages to consider, John 8:12; 9:5; 12:35-36, 46
- 2. Walking with our Saviour confessing our sins to God and one another, 1 John 1:9
 Others passages to consider, Matt. 6:12; 18:21-35; Mark 11:25-26 NKJV; Luke 6:37; 17:1-4
- 3. Walking with our Saviour He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins and the sins of the whole world, 1 John 2:2, cp. 1 John 4:10; Romans 3:25
- 4. Walking with our Saviour Not being ashamed at His coming, 1 John 2:28.
 - The key to not being ashamed is to abide in Him, cp. John 15:4-8. The concept of abiding or remaining is found 11x in Chapter 15 and 40x in the Gospel of John and 27x in John's epistles
- 5. Walking with our Saviour Recognizing His purpose for coming
 - To take away sin, 1 John 3:5
 - To destroy the devil's work, 1 John 3:8
- 6. Walking with our Saviour Recognizing God's love for us
 - Jesus laid down His life for us, 1 John 3:16; 4:9-10; John 10:11; 15:13
- 7. Walking with our Saviour Recognizing our need of a Saviour every day of our lives, 1 John 4:14
- 8. Walking with our Saviour Overcoming the world, 1 John 5:5-9
- 9. Walking with our Saviour Giving us understanding as to who He is.
 - He is the Way, the truth and the life, 1 John 5:20; John 14:6
 - He is the Eternal Life, cp. John 17:1-5
- 10. Walking with our Saviour Loving our Saviour, loving one another, 1 John 4:7-5:1; John 15:12; Rev. 2:4
